Successes: 2015 -2018

Training & Capacity Development:

- 48 PDNA & Disaster Recovery Frameworks (DRF)
 Trainings at country and regional level
- 178 representative from 32 countries trained on laws & regulations for DRR
- 550 airport personnel of 20 airports trained in disaster preparedness
- 14 regional and global NDC dialogues

Policy & Planning:

- 43 climate change commitments (NDCs)
- 13 National DRR Strategies/Plans aligned with Sendai Framework
- 15 reviews of DRR legal frameworks supported
- 24 SDG Mainstreaming, Acceleration, Policy Support (MAPS) processes risk-informed
- 3 Disaster Recovery Frameworks





Strengthening Tsunami Preparedness in Schools





Results:

- 51,426 students and teachers participated
- 102 schools in high risk areas prepared
 (as of October 13, 2018)

- Partnership approach with governments, local authorities,
 NGOs and communities in 18 Asia-Pacific countries
- Aims to strengthen school preparedness to tsunamis
- Financially supported by the Government of Japan
- Schools assess their tsunami/disaster risk, developed emergency procedures and conducted evacuation drills

Results and impact:

- Five-year plan to include disaster education in the national school curriculum in Viet Nam
- Draft National Coastal Earthquake and Tsunami Response and Preparedness Policy framework developed in Pakistan
- Agreements with 8 hotels in Bali island to use their buildings as safe areas during the drills and disasters
- Tested a mobile app to monitor large-scale evacuations and prepare for the first-ever National Tsunami Drill in Fiji

Global Centre for Disaster Statistics



GCDS Launched at the 3rd UN World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction in March 2015



Piloted in 7 countries in Asia:

- Cambodia
- Indonesia
- Maldives
- Myanmar
- Philippines
- Sri Lanka,
- Nepal





The CC & DRR Cluster: 2012-2016*






^{*}Programme Expenditures at country, regional and HQ levels


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












Global Preparedness Partnership



The goal of the Global Preparedness Partnership (GPP) is for countries to reach a minimum level of preparedness so that disaster events can be better managed locally with reduced need for international assistance.

- Partnership between countries, international resourcing partners and multilateral organizations
- Builds on existing initiatives
- Supports high-risk countries so that they are ready to respond to and recover from disasters caused by Natural hazards and climate events


















INFORM – Open-Source Risk Index
